## 4 - First Aid Measures

Ingestion (Swallowed): Do not induce vomiting. Call physician or poison control center for advice.

## 5 - Fire Fighting Measures

**Specific Hazards Arising from the Chemical:** This product is not classified as flammable or combustible but will burn under fire conditions.


